## Daily Reading for Sunday, June 28th, 2020 Reading 1, Second Kings 4:8-11, 14-16

One day as <u>Elisha</u> was on his way to Shunem, a <u>woman</u> of rank who lived there pressed him to stay and eat there. After this he always broke his journey for a meal when he passed that way. She said to her husband, 'Look, I am sure the <u>man</u> who is constantly passing our way must be a holy <u>man</u> of God. Let us build him a small walled room, and put him a bed in it, and a table and chair and lamp; whenever he comes to us he can rest there.' One day when he came, he retired to the upper room and lay down. 'What can I do for you then?' he asked. Gehazi replied, 'Well, she has no son and her husband is old.' Elisha said, 'Call her.' The servant called her and she stood at the door. 'This <u>time</u> next year', he said, 'you <u>will</u> hold a son in your arms.' But she said, 'No, my lord, do not deceive your servant.'

## Responsorial Psalm, Psalms 89:2-3, 16-17, 18-19

for you have said: love is built to last for ever, you have fixed your constancy firm in the heavens. 'I have made a covenant with my Chosen One, sworn an oath to my servant David:

In your name they rejoice all day long, by your saving justice they are raised up. You are the flower of their strength, by your favour our <u>strength</u> is triumphant;

for to <u>Yahweh</u> belongs our shield, to the Holy One of Israel our king. Once you spoke in a vision, to your faithful you said: 'I have given <u>strength</u> to a warrior, I have raised up a <u>man</u> chosen from my people.

## Reading 2, Romans 6:3-4, 8-11

You cannot have forgotten that all of us, when we were baptised into <u>Christ</u> Jesus, were baptised into his death. So by our <u>baptism</u> into his death we were buried with him, so that as <u>Christ</u> was raised from the dead by the Father's glorious power, we too should begin living a new life. But we believe that, if we died with Christ, then we shall live with him too. We know that <u>Christ</u> has been raised from the dead and <u>will</u> never die again. Death has no power over him any more. For by dying, he is dead to <u>sin</u> once and for all, and now the <u>life</u> that he lives is <u>life</u> with God. In the same way, you must see yourselves as being dead to <u>sin</u> but alive for <u>God</u> in <u>Christ</u> Jesus.

## Gospel, Matthew 10:37-42

'No one who prefers father or mother to me is worthy of me. No one who prefers son or daughter to me is worthy of me. Anyone who does not take his cross and follow in my footsteps is not worthy of me. Anyone who finds his <u>life will</u> lose it; anyone who loses his <u>life</u> for my sake <u>will</u> find it. 'Anyone who welcomes you welcomes me; and anyone who welcomes me welcomes the one who sent me. 'Anyone who welcomes a <u>prophet</u> because he is a <u>prophet will</u> have a prophet's reward; and anyone who welcomes an upright <u>person</u> because he is upright <u>will</u> have the reward of an upright person. 'If anyone gives so much as a cup of cold water to one of these little ones because he is a disciple, then in <u>truth</u> I tell you, he <u>will</u> most certainly not go without his reward.'
