

INFORMATION ABOUT THE ELECTION 2020

When can you vote

You can vote in the church or you can send the ballot paper by 1st class post¹

You can vote as late as on the election day

The ballot boxes will be in the church until after mass on Sunday 18th October 2020, then removed by approx. 19:00 hours

You can vote until 6 persons

You can vote / tick for six persons or fewer.

How to determine who is elected to the parish council

The four who get the most votes will be elected to the parish council; the two who follow in accordance with the number of votes will be deputies. In addition, the parish priest can freely choose two people from the congregation to the parish council. A youth representative is also included in the parish council.

Be accurate when voting, ballot papers not filled correctly will be excluded.

- Do not tick for more than six people
- Do not write up other people than those already listed
- Do not cross out any persons
- Do not give the same person more than one vote
- It is only allowed to vote once
- Enter your name and address and date of birth very clearly (preferably in capital letters) on the outer envelope. If name cannot be read, the vote must be rejected.
- Each person who votes must use his own ballot paper, more people cannot vote on the same one. If several people join forces to send votes per. mail, the name of each person must be identifiable, if not all votes will be rejected
