# Daily Reading for Sunday, May 30th, 2021

## Reading 1, Deuteronomy 4:32-34, 39-40

<sup>32</sup> 'Put this question, then, to the ages that are past, that have gone before you, from when <u>God</u> created the human race on earth: Was there ever a word so majestic, from one end of <u>heaven</u> to the other? Was anything like it ever heard? <sup>33</sup> Did ever a people hear the voice of the living <u>God</u> speaking from the heart of the fire, as you have heard it, and remain alive? <sup>34</sup> Has it ever been known before that any <u>god</u> took action himself to bring one nation out of another one, by ordeals, signs, wonders, <u>war</u> with mighty hand and outstretched arm, by fearsome terrors -- all of which things <u>Yahweh</u> your <u>God</u> has done for you before your eyes in Egypt?

<sup>39</sup> 'Hence, grasp this today and meditate on it carefully: <u>Yahweh</u> is the true God, in <u>heaven</u> above as on earth beneath, he and no other. <sup>40</sup> Keep his laws and commandments as I give them to you today, so that you and your <u>children</u> after you may prosper and live long in the country that <u>Yahweh</u> your <u>God</u> is giving you for ever.'

## Responsorial Psalm, *Psalms 33:4-5, 6, 9, 18-19, 20, 22*

<sup>4</sup> The word of <u>Yahweh</u> is straightforward, all he does springs from his constancy. <sup>5</sup> He loves uprightness and justice; the faithful love of <u>Yahweh</u> fills the earth.

<sup>6</sup> By the word of <u>Yahweh</u> the heavens were made, by the breath of his mouth all their array.

<sup>9</sup> for, the moment he spoke, it was so, no sooner had he commanded, than there it stood!

<sup>18</sup> But see how <u>Yahweh</u> watches over those who fear him, those who rely on his faithful love, <sup>19</sup> to rescue them from death and keep them alive in famine.

<sup>20</sup> We are waiting for Yahweh; he is our help and our shield,

<sup>22</sup> Yahweh, let your faithful love rest on us, as our <u>hope</u> has rested in you.

## Reading 2, Romans 8:14-17

<sup>14</sup> All who are guided by the <u>Spirit</u> of <u>God</u> are sons of God; <sup>15</sup> for what you received was not the <u>spirit</u> of slavery to bring you back into fear; you received the <u>Spirit</u> of adoption, enabling us to cry out, 'Abba, Father!' <sup>16</sup> The <u>Spirit</u> himself joins with our <u>spirit</u> to bear <u>witness</u> that we are <u>children</u> of God. <sup>17</sup> And if we are children, then we are heirs, heirs of <u>God</u> and jointheirs with Christ, provided that we share his suffering, so as to share his glory.

#### Gospel, Matthew 28:16-20

<sup>16</sup> Meanwhile the eleven disciples set out for Galilee, to the mountain where <u>Jesus</u> had arranged to meet them. <sup>17</sup> When they saw him they fell down before him, though some hesitated. <sup>18</sup> Jesus came up and spoke to them. He said, 'All authority in <u>heaven</u> and on earth has been given to me. <sup>19</sup> Go, therefore, make disciples of all nations; baptise them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, <sup>20</sup> and teach them to observe all the commands I gave you. And look, I am with you always; yes, to the end of time.'
