# Daily Reading for Sunday, June 6th, 2021 -Corpus Christi

### Reading1, 2, Exodus 24: 3-8

<sup>3</sup> Moses went and told the people all Yahweh's words and all the laws, and all the people answered with one voice, 'All the words <u>Yahweh</u> has spoken we <u>will</u> carry out!' <sup>4</sup> Moses put all Yahweh's words into writing, and early next morning he built an altar at the foot of the mountain, with twelve standing-stones for the twelve tribes of Israel. <sup>5</sup> Then he sent certain young <u>Israelites</u> to offer burnt <u>offerings</u> and <u>sacrifice</u> bullocks to <u>Yahweh</u> as communion sacrifices. <sup>6</sup> Moses then took half the blood and put it into basins, and the other half he sprinkled on the altar. <sup>7</sup> Then, taking the Book of the Covenant, he read it to the listening people, who then said, 'We shall do everything that <u>Yahweh</u> has said; we shall obey.' <sup>8</sup> Moses then took the blood and sprinkled it over the people, saying, 'This is the blood of the covenant which <u>Yahweh</u> has made with you, entailing all these stipulations.'

## Responsorial Psalm 116 (115), 12-13.15+16bc.17-18

<sup>12</sup> What return can I make to <u>Yahweh</u> for his generosity to me?
<sup>13</sup> I shall take up the cup of <u>salvation</u> and call on the name of Yahweh.

<sup>14</sup> I shall fulfil my <u>vows</u> to Yahweh, witnessed by all his people.

<sup>15</sup> Costly in Yahweh's sight is the death of his faithful.

<sup>16</sup> I beg you, Yahweh! I am your servant, I am your servant and my mother was your servant; you have undone my fetters.

<sup>17</sup> I shall offer you a <u>sacrifice</u> of thanksgiving and call on the name of Yahweh. <sup>18</sup> I shall fulfil my <u>vows</u> to Yahweh, witnessed by all his people,

#### Reading 2, Hebr 9:11-15

<sup>11</sup> But now <u>Christ</u> has come, as the high <u>priest</u> of all the blessings which were to come. He has passed through the greater, the more perfect tent, not made by human hands, that is, not of this created order; <sup>12</sup> and he has entered the sanctuary once and for all, taking with him not the blood of goats and bull calves, but his own blood, having won an eternal redemption. <sup>13</sup> The blood of goats and bulls and the <u>ashes</u> of a heifer, sprinkled on those who have incurred defilement, may restore their bodily purity. <sup>14</sup> How much more will the blood of Christ, who offered himself, blameless as he was, to God through the eternal Spirit, purify our conscience from dead actions so that we can worship the living God. <sup>15</sup> This makes him the mediator of a new covenant, so that, now that a death has occurred to redeem the sins committed under an earlier covenant, those who have been called to an eternal inheritance may receive the promise.

## Gospel, Mark 14:12-16.22-26

<sup>12</sup> On the first day of Unleavened Bread, when the <u>Passover</u> lamb was sacrificed, his disciples said to him, 'Where do you want us to go and make the preparations for you to eat the Passover?' <sup>13</sup> So he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the city and you <u>will</u> meet a <u>man</u> carrying a pitcher of water. Follow him, <sup>14</sup> and say to the owner of the house which he enters, "The Master says: Where is the room for me to eat the <u>Passover</u> with my disciples?" <sup>15</sup> He <u>will</u> show you a large upper room furnished with couches, all prepared. Make the preparations for us there.' <sup>16</sup> The disciples set out and went to the city and found everything as he had told them, and prepared the Passover.

<sup>22</sup> And as they were eating he took bread, and when he had said the <u>blessing</u> he broke it and gave it to them. 'Take it,' he said, 'this is my body.' <sup>23</sup> Then he took a cup, and when he had given thanks he handed it to them, and all drank from it, <sup>24</sup> and he said to them, 'This is my blood, the blood of the covenant, poured out for many. <sup>25</sup> In <u>truth</u> I tell you, I shall never drink wine any more until the day I drink the new wine in the kingdom of God.' <sup>26</sup> After the <u>psalms</u> had been sung they left for the Mount of Olives.
