## Daily Reading for Sunday, August 8th, 2021

Reading 1, First Kings 19:4-8

<sup>4</sup> He himself went on into the desert, a day's journey, and sitting under a furze bush wished he were dead. 'Yahweh,' he said, 'I have had enough. Take my life; I am no better than my ancestors.' <sup>5</sup> Then he lay down and went to sleep. Then all of a sudden an <u>angel</u> touched him and said, 'Get up and eat.' <sup>6</sup> He looked round, and there at his head was a scone baked on hot stones, and a jar of water. He ate and drank and then lay down again. <sup>7</sup> But the <u>angel</u> of <u>Yahweh</u> came back a second <u>time</u> and touched him and said, 'Get up and eat, or the journey <u>will</u> be too long for you.' <sup>8</sup> So he got up and ate and drank, and strengthened by that food he walked for forty days and forty nights until he reached Horeb, God's mountain.

Responsorial Psalm, *Psalms 34:2-3, 4-5, 6-7, 8-9* 

<sup>2</sup> I <u>will</u> praise <u>Yahweh</u> from my heart; let the humble hear and rejoice. <sup>3</sup> Proclaim with me the greatness of Yahweh, let us acclaim his name together.

<sup>4</sup> I seek <u>Yahweh</u> and he answers me, frees me from all my fears. <sup>5</sup> Fix your gaze on <u>Yahweh</u> and your face <u>will</u> grow bright, you <u>will</u> never hang your head in shame.

- <sup>6</sup> A pauper calls out and <u>Yahweh</u> hears, saves him from all his troubles. <sup>7</sup> The <u>angel</u> of <u>Yahweh</u> encamps around those who fear him, and rescues them.
- <sup>8</sup> Taste and see that <u>Yahweh</u> is good. How blessed are those who take refuge in him. <sup>9</sup> Fear Yahweh, you his holy ones; those who fear him lack for nothing.

## Reading 2, Ephesians 4:30-5:2

<sup>30</sup> do not grieve the <u>Holy Spirit</u> of <u>God</u> who has marked you with his seal, ready for the day when we shall be set free. <sup>31</sup> Any bitterness or bad temper or <u>anger</u> or shouting or abuse must be far removed from you -- as must every kind of malice. <sup>32</sup> Be generous to one another, sympathetic, forgiving each other as readily as <u>God</u> forgave you in Christ. <sup>1</sup> As God's dear children, then, take him as your pattern, <sup>2</sup> and follow <u>Christ</u> by loving as he loved you, giving himself up for us as an offering and a sweet-smelling sacrifice to God.

## Gospel, *John 6:41-51*

<sup>41</sup> Meanwhile the <u>Jews</u> were complaining to each other about him, because he had said, 'I am the bread that has come down from heaven.' <sup>42</sup> They were saying, 'Surely this is <u>Jesus</u> son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know. How can he now say, "I have come

down from heaven?" ' 43 Jesus said in reply to them, 'Stop complaining to each other. 44 'No one can come to me unless drawn by the Father who sent me, and I will raise that person up on the last day. 45 It is written in the prophets: They will all be taught by God; everyone who has listened to the Father, and learnt from him, comes to me. 46 Not that anybody has seen the Father, except him who has his being from God: he has seen the Father. <sup>47</sup> In all truth I tell you, everyone who believes has eternal life. 48 I am the bread of life. <sup>49</sup> Your fathers ate manna in the desert and they are dead; 50 but this is the bread which comes down from heaven, so that a person may eat it and not die. 51 I am the living bread which has come down from heaven. Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I shall give is my flesh, for the <u>life</u> of the world.'
