# Daily Reading for March 19th, St. Joseph.

# Reading 1, Second Samuel 7:4-5, 12-14, 16

<sup>4</sup> But that very night, the word of <u>Yahweh</u> came to Nathan: <sup>5</sup> 'Go and tell my servant David, "Yahweh says this: Are you to build me a <u>temple</u> for me to live in? <sup>12</sup> And when your days are over and you fall asleep with your ancestors, I shall appoint your heir, your own son to succeed you (and I shall make his sovereignty secure. <sup>13</sup> He <u>will</u> build a <u>temple</u> for my name) and I shall make his royal <u>throne</u> secure for ever. <sup>14</sup> I shall be a father to him and he a son to me; if he does wrong, I shall punish him with a rod such as men use, with blows such as mankind gives. <sup>16</sup> Your dynasty and your sovereignty <u>will</u> ever stand firm before me and your <u>throne</u> be for ever secure." '

# Responsorial Psalm, *Psalms* 89:2-3, 4-5, 27, 29

- <sup>2</sup> for you have said: love is built to last for ever, you have fixed your constancy firm in the heavens. <sup>3</sup> 'I have made a covenant with my Chosen One, sworn an oath to my servant David:
- <sup>4</sup> I have made your dynasty firm for ever, built your <u>throne</u> stable age after age. <sup>5</sup> The heavens praise your wonders, Yahweh, your constancy in the gathering of your faithful.
- <sup>27</sup> So I shall make him my first-born, the highest of earthly kings.
- <sup>29</sup> I have established his dynasty for ever, his <u>throne</u> to be as lasting as the heavens.

# Reading 2, Romans 4:13, 16-18, 22

- <sup>13</sup> For the promise to <u>Abraham</u> and his descendants that he should inherit the world was not through the Law, but through the uprightness of faith.
- <sup>16</sup> That is why the promise is to faith, so that it comes as a free gift and is secure for all the descendants, not only those who rely on the <u>Law</u> but all those others who rely on the <u>faith</u> of Abraham, the ancestor of us all <sup>17</sup> (as <u>scripture</u> says: I have made you the father of many nations). <u>Abraham</u> is our father in the eyes of God, in whom he put his faith, and who brings the dead to <u>life</u> and calls into existence what does not yet exist. <sup>18</sup> Though there seemed no hope, he hoped and believed that he was to become father of many nations in fulfilment of the promise: Just so <u>will</u> your descendants be.
- <sup>22</sup> This is the <u>faith</u> that was reckoned to him as uprightness.

#### Gospel, *Luke 2:41-51*

- <sup>41</sup> Every year his <u>parents</u> used to go to <u>Jerusalem</u> for the feast of the Passover. <sup>42</sup> When he was twelve years old, they went up for the feast as usual. <sup>43</sup> When the days of the feast were over and they set off home, the boy <u>Jesus</u> stayed behind in <u>Jerusalem</u> without his <u>parents</u> knowing it. <sup>44</sup> They assumed he was somewhere in the party, and it was only after a day's journey that they went to look for him among their relations and acquaintances. <sup>45</sup> When they failed to find him they went back to <u>Jerusalem</u> looking for him everywhere.
- <sup>46</sup> It happened that, three days later, they found him in the Temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them, and asking them questions; <sup>47</sup> and all those who heard him were astounded at his intelligence and his replies. <sup>48</sup> They were overcome when they saw him, and his mother said to him, 'My child, why have you done this to us? See how worried your father and I have been, looking for you.' <sup>49</sup> He replied, 'Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?' <sup>50</sup> But they did not understand what he meant. <sup>51</sup> He went down with them then and came to <u>Nazareth</u> and lived under their authority. His mother stored up all these things in her heart.
