Reading 1, Isaiah 7:10-14

- ¹⁰ Yahweh spoke to Ahaz again and said:
- of Sheol or in the heights above. ¹² But Ahaz said, 'I will not ask. I will not put Yahweh to the test.' ¹³ He then said: Listen now, House of David: are you not satisfied with trying human patience that you should try my God's patience too? ¹⁴ The Lord will give you a sign in any case: It is this: the young woman is with child and will give birth to a son whom she will call Immanuel.

Responsorial Psalm, *Psalms* 40:7-8, 8-9, 10, 11

⁷ then I said, 'Here I am, I am coming.' In the scroll of the book it is written of me, ⁸ my delight is to do your will;

your law, my God, is deep in my heart. ⁹ I proclaimed the saving <u>justice</u> of <u>Yahweh</u> in the great assembly. See, I <u>will</u> not hold my tongue, as you well know.

¹⁰ I have not kept your saving <u>justice</u> locked in the depths of my heart, but have spoken of your constancy and saving help. I have made no <u>secret</u> of your faithful and steadfast love, in the great assembly.

¹¹ You, Yahweh, have not withheld your tenderness from me; your faithful and steadfast love will always guard me.

Reading 2, Hebrews 10:4-10

- ⁴ Bulls' blood and goats' blood are incapable of taking away sins,
- ⁵ and that is why he said, on coming into the world: You wanted no <u>sacrifice</u> or cereal offering, but you gave me a body.
- ⁶ You took no pleasure in burnt offering or <u>sacrifice</u> for sin;
- ⁷ then I said, 'Here I am, I am coming,' in the scroll of the book it is written of me, to do your will, God.
- ⁸ He says first You did not want what the <u>Law</u> lays down as the things to be offered, that is: the sacrifices, the cereal offerings, the burnt <u>offerings</u> and the sacrifices for sin, and you took no pleasure in them;
- ⁹ and then he says: Here I am! I am coming to do your will. He is abolishing the first sort to establish the second.

¹⁰ And this <u>will</u> was for us to be made holy by the offering of the body of <u>Jesus Christ</u> made once and for all.

Gospel, *Luke 1:26-38*

- ²⁶ In the sixth month the <u>angel</u> Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth,
- ²⁷ to a virgin betrothed to a <u>man</u> named Joseph, of the House of David; and the virgin's name was Mary.
- ²⁸ He went in and said to her, 'Rejoice, you who enjoy God's favor! The <u>Lord</u> is with you.'
- ²⁹ She was deeply disturbed by these words and asked herself what this greeting could mean,
- ³⁰ but the <u>angel</u> said to her, 'Mary, do not be afraid; you have won God's favour.
- ³¹ Look! You are to conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you must name him Jesus.
- ³² He <u>will</u> be great and <u>will</u> be called Son of the Most High. The <u>Lord God will</u> give him the <u>throne</u> of his ancestor David;

- ³³ he <u>will</u> rule over the House of <u>Jacob</u> for ever and his reign <u>will</u> have no end.'
- ³⁴ Mary said to the angel, 'But how can this come about, since I have no knowledge of man?'
- ³⁵ The <u>angel</u> answered, 'The <u>Holy Spirit will</u> come upon you, and the power of the Most High <u>will</u> cover you with its shadow. And so the child <u>will</u> be holy and <u>will</u> be called Son of God.
- ³⁶ And I tell you this too: your cousin <u>Elizabeth</u> also, in her old age, has conceived a son, and she whom people called barren is now in her sixth month,
- ³⁷ for nothing is impossible to God.'
- ³⁸ Mary said, 'You see before you the Lord's servant, let it happen to me as you have said.' And the <u>angel</u> left her.
