# Daily Reading for Sunday, March 6th, 2022

## Reading 1, Deuteronomy 26:4-10

<sup>4</sup> 'The priest will then take the basket from your hand and lay it before the altar of Yahweh your God. <sup>5</sup> In the presence of Yahweh your God, you will then pronounce these words: "My father was a wandering Aramaean, who went down to Egypt with a small group of men, and stayed there, until he there became a great, powerful and numerous nation. <sup>6</sup> The Egyptians ill-treated us, they oppressed us and inflicted harsh slavery on us. <sup>7</sup> But we called on Yahweh, God of our ancestors. Yahweh heard our voice and saw our misery, our toil and our oppression; 8 and Yahweh brought us out of Egypt with mighty hand and outstretched arm, with great terror, and with signs and wonders. <sup>9</sup> He brought us here and has given us this country, a country flowing with milk and honey. 10 Hence, I now bring the first-fruits of the soil that you, Yahweh, have given me." 'You will then lay them before Yahweh your God, and prostrate yourself in the presence of Yahweh your God.

#### Responsorial Psalm, *Psalms* 91:1-2, 10-11, 12-13, 14-15

- <sup>1</sup> You who live in the <u>secret</u> place of Elyon, spend your nights in the shelter of Shaddai, <sup>2</sup> saying to Yahweh, 'My refuge, my fortress, my <u>God</u> in whom I trust!'
- <sup>10</sup> No disaster can overtake you, no plague come near your tent; <sup>11</sup> he has given his <u>angels</u> orders about you to guard you wherever you go.
- <sup>12</sup> They will carry you in their arms in case you trip over a stone.
- <sup>13</sup> You <u>will</u> walk upon wild beast and adder, you <u>will</u> trample young lions and snakes.
- <sup>14</sup> 'Since he clings to me I rescue him, I raise him high, since he acknowledges my name. <sup>15</sup> He calls to me and I answer him: in distress I am at his side, I rescue him and bring him honour.

### **Reading 2, Romans 10:8-13**

<sup>8</sup> What does it say, then? The word is very near to you; it is in your mouth and in your heart, that is, the word of faith, the <u>faith</u> which we preach, <sup>9</sup> that if you declare with your mouth that <u>Jesus</u> is Lord, and if you believe with your heart that <u>God</u> raised him from the dead, then you <u>will</u> be saved. <sup>10</sup> It is by believing with the heart that you are justified, and by making the declaration with your lips that you are saved. <sup>11</sup> When <u>scripture</u> says: No one who relies on this <u>will</u> be brought to disgrace, <sup>12</sup> it makes no distinction between Jew and Greek: the same <u>Lord</u> is the <u>Lord</u> of all, and his generosity is offered to all who appeal to him, <sup>13</sup> for all who call on the name of the Lord will be saved.

#### Gospel, *Luke 4:1-13*

<sup>1</sup> Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus left the Jordan and was led by the Spirit into the desert, <sup>2</sup> for forty days being put to the test by the devil. During that time he ate nothing and at the end he was hungry. <sup>3</sup> Then the devil said to him, 'If you are Son of God, tell this stone to turn into a loaf.' 4 But Jesus replied, 'Scripture says: Human beings live not on bread alone.' 5 Then leading him to a height, the devil showed him in a moment of time all the kingdoms of the world <sup>6</sup> and said to him, 'I will give you all this power and their splendour, for it has been handed over to me, for me to give it to anyone I choose. <sup>7</sup> Do homage, then, to me, and it shall all be yours.' 8 But Jesus answered him, 'Scripture says: You must do homage to the Lord your God, him alone you must serve.' <sup>9</sup> Then he led him to <u>Jerusalem</u> and set him on the parapet of the Temple. 'If you are Son of God,' he said to him, 'throw yourself down from here, <sup>10</sup> for scripture says: He has given his angels orders about you, to guard you, and again: <sup>11</sup> They will carry you in their arms in
