Reading 1, Sirach 3:17-18, 20, 28-29

¹⁷ My child, be gentle in carrying out your business, and you <u>will</u> be better loved than a lavish giver.

¹⁸ The greater you are, the more humbly you should behave, and then you <u>will</u> find favour with the Lord;

²⁰ for great though the power of the <u>Lord</u> is, he accepts the homage of the humble.

²⁸ For the disease of the proud there is no cure, since an <u>evil</u> growth has taken root there.

²⁹ The heart of the sensible <u>will</u> reflect on parables, an attentive ear is the sage's dream.

Responsorial Psalm, Psalms 68:4-5, 6-7, 10-11

⁴ Sing to God, play music to his name, build a road for the Rider of the Clouds, rejoice in Yahweh, dance before him.⁵ Father of orphans, defender of widows, such is <u>God</u> in his holy dwelling.

⁶ God gives the lonely a home to live in, leads prisoners out into prosperity, but rebels must live in the bare wastelands. ⁷ God, when you set out at the head of your people, when you strode over the desert,

¹⁰ Your <u>family</u> found a home, which you in your generosity provided for the humble.

¹¹ The Lord gave a command, the good news of a countless army.

Reading 2, Hebrews 12:18-19, 22-24

¹⁸ What you have come to is nothing known to the senses: not a blazing fire, or gloom or total darkness, or a storm;

¹⁹ or trumpet-blast or the sound of a voice speaking which made everyone that heard it beg that no more should be said to them.

²² But what you have come to is Mount Zion and the city of the living God, the heavenly <u>Jerusalem</u> where the millions of <u>angels</u> have gathered for the festival,

²³ with the whole Church of <u>first-born</u> sons, enrolled as citizens of heaven. You have come to <u>God</u> himself, the supreme Judge, and to the spirits of the upright who have been made perfect;

²⁴ and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant, and to purifying blood which pleads more insistently than Abel's.

Gospel, Luke 14:1, 7-14

¹ Now it happened that on a <u>Sabbath</u> day he had gone to share a meal in the house of one of the leading Pharisees; and they watched him closely.

⁷ He then told the guests a parable, because he had noticed how they picked the places of honour. He said this,

⁸ 'When someone invites you to a wedding feast, do not take your seat in the place of honour. A more distinguished <u>person</u> than you may have been invited,

⁹ and the <u>person</u> who invited you both may come and say, "Give up your place to this man." And then, to your embarrassment, you <u>will</u> have to go and take the lowest place.

¹⁰ No; when you are a guest, make your way to the lowest place and sit there, so that, when your <u>host</u> comes, he may say, "My friend, move up higher." Then, everyone with you at the table <u>will</u> see you honoured.

¹¹ For everyone who raises himself up <u>will</u> be humbled, and the one who humbles himself <u>will</u> be raised up.'

¹² Then he said to his host, 'When you give a lunch or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relations or rich neighbours, in case they invite you back and so repay you.

¹³ No; when you have a party, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind;

¹⁴ then you <u>will</u> be blessed, for they have no means to repay you and so you <u>will</u> be repaid when the upright rise again.'
