Daily Reading for Sunday, September 25th, 2022

Reading 1, Amos 6:1, 4-7

¹ Disaster for those so comfortable in Zion and for those so confident on the hill of Samaria, the notables of this first of nations, those to whom the House of Israel has recourse! ⁴ Lying on <u>ivory</u> beds and sprawling on their divans, they dine on lambs from the flock, and stall-fattened veal; ⁵ they bawl to the sound of the lyre and, like David, they invent musical instruments; ⁶ they drink wine by the bowlful, and lard themselves with the finest oils, but for the ruin of <u>Joseph</u> they care nothing. ⁷ That is why they <u>will</u> now go into captivity, heading the <u>column</u> of captives. The sprawlers' revelry is over.

Responsorial Psalm, Psalms 146:7, 8-9, 9-10

⁷ gives <u>justice</u> to the oppressed, gives food to the hungry; <u>Yahweh</u> sets prisoners free.

⁸ Yahweh gives sight to the blind, lifts up those who are bowed down.

⁹ Yahweh protects the stranger, he sustains the orphan and the widow. <u>Yahweh</u> loves the upright, but he frustrates the wicked.

¹⁰ Yahweh reigns for ever, your God, Zion, from age to age.

Reading 2, First Timothy 6:11-16

¹¹ But, as someone dedicated to God, avoid all that. You must aim to be upright and religious, filled with <u>faith</u> and love, perseverance and gentleness. ¹² Fight the <u>good</u> fight of <u>faith</u> and win the eternal <u>life</u> to which you were called and for which you made your noble profession of <u>faith</u> before many witnesses. ¹³ Now, before God, the source of all life, and before <u>Jesus</u> Christ, who witnessed to his noble profession of <u>faith</u> before Pontius Pilate, I charge you ¹⁴ to do all that you have been told, with no faults or failures, until the appearing of our <u>Lord Jesus</u> Christ, ¹⁵ who at the due <u>time will</u> be revealed by God, the blessed and only Ruler of all, the King of <u>kings</u> and the <u>Lord</u> of lords, ¹⁶ who alone is immortal, whose home is in inaccessible light, whom no human being has seen or is able to see: to him be <u>honour</u> and everlasting power. Gospel, Luke 16:19-31

¹⁹ 'There was a rich <u>man</u> who used to dress in purple and fine linen and feast magnificently every day.

 20 And at his gate there used to lie a poor <u>man</u> called Lazarus, covered with sores,

²¹ who longed to fill himself with what fell from the rich man's table. Even dogs came and licked his sores.

 22 Now it happened that the poor <u>man</u> died and was carried away by the <u>angels</u> into Abraham's embrace. The rich <u>man</u> also died and was buried.

 23 'In his torment in Hades he looked up and saw <u>Abraham</u> a long way off with <u>Lazarus</u> in his embrace.

²⁴ So he cried out, "Father Abraham, pity me and send <u>Lazarus</u> to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue, for I am in agony in these flames."

²⁵ Abraham said, "My son, remember that during your <u>life</u> you had your fill of <u>good</u> things, just as <u>Lazarus</u> his fill of bad. Now he is being comforted here while you are in agony.

²⁶ But that is not all: between us and you a great gulf has been fixed, to prevent those who want to cross from our side to yours or from your side to ours."

²⁷ 'So he said, "Father, I beg you then to send <u>Lazarus</u> to my father's house,

²⁸ since I have five brothers, to give them warning so that they do not come to this place of torment too."

²⁹ Abraham said, "They have <u>Moses</u> and the prophets, let them listen to them."

³⁰ The rich <u>man</u> replied, "Ah no, father Abraham, but if someone comes to them from the dead, they <u>will</u> repent."

³¹ Then <u>Abraham</u> said to him, "If they <u>will</u> not listen either to <u>Moses</u> or to the prophets, they <u>will</u> not be convinced even if someone should rise from the dead."
