# Daily Reading for Sunday, January 29th, 2023

#### Reading 1, Zephaniah 2:3; 3:12-13

<sup>3</sup> Seek Yahweh, all you humble of the earth, who obey his commands. Seek uprightness, seek humility: you may perhaps find shelter on the Day of Yahweh's anger.

<sup>12</sup> But in you I shall leave surviving a humble and lowly people,
<sup>13</sup> and those who are left in Israel <u>will</u> take refuge in the name of Yahweh. They <u>will</u> do no wrong, <u>will</u> tell no lies; nor <u>will</u> a deceitful tongue be found in their mouths. But they <u>will</u> be able to graze and rest with no one to alarm them.

### Responsorial Psalm, Psalms 146:6-7, 8-9, 9-10

<sup>6</sup> who made <u>heaven</u> and earth, the sea and all that is in them. He keeps <u>faith</u> for ever, <sup>7</sup> gives <u>justice</u> to the oppressed, gives food to the hungry; <u>Yahweh</u> sets prisoners free.

<sup>8</sup> Yahweh gives sight to the blind, lifts up those who are bowed down. <sup>9</sup> Yahweh protects the stranger, he sustains the orphan and the widow.

<u>Yahweh</u> loves the upright,but he frustrates the wicked. <sup>10</sup> Yahweh reigns for ever, your God, Zion, from age to age.

## Reading 2, First Corinthians 1:26-31

<sup>26</sup> Consider, brothers, how you were called; not many of you are wise by human standards, not many influential, not many from noble families. <sup>27</sup> No, <u>God</u> chose those who by human standards are fools to shame the wise; he chose those who by human standards are weak to shame the strong, <sup>28</sup> those who by human standards are common and contemptible -- indeed those who count for nothing -- to reduce to nothing all those that do count for something, <sup>29</sup> so that no human being might feel boastful before God. <sup>30</sup> It is by him that you exist in <u>Christ</u> Jesus, who for us was made <u>wisdom</u> from God, and saving justice and holiness and redemption.

<sup>31</sup> As <u>scripture</u> says: If anyone wants to boast, let him boast of the Lord.

## Gospel, Matthew 5:1-12

<sup>1</sup> Seeing the crowds, he went onto the mountain. And when he was seated his disciples came to him. <sup>2</sup> Then he began to speak. This is what he taught them: <sup>3</sup> How blessed are the poor in spirit: the kingdom of <u>Heaven</u> is theirs

.<sup>4</sup> Blessed are the gentle: they shall have the earth as inheritance.

<sup>5</sup> Blessed are those who mourn: they shall be comforted.

<sup>6</sup> Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for uprightness: they shall have their fill.

<sup>7</sup> Blessed are the merciful: they shall have mercy shown them.

<sup>8</sup> Blessed are the pure in heart: they shall see God.

<sup>9</sup> Blessed are the peacemakers: they shall be recognised as <u>children</u> of God. <sup>10</sup> Blessed are those who are persecuted in the <u>cause</u> of uprightness: the kingdom of <u>Heaven</u> is theirs.

<sup>11</sup> 'Blessed are you when people abuse you and persecute you and speak all kinds of <u>calumny</u> against you falsely on my account.

<sup>12</sup> Rejoice and be glad, for your reward <u>will</u> be great in heaven; this is how they persecuted the prophets before you.
