Daily Reading for Easter Monday.

Reading 1, Acts 2:14, 22-32

¹⁴ Then Peter stood up with the Eleven and addressed them in a loud voice: 'Men of Judaea, and all you who live in Jerusalem, make no mistake about this, but listen carefully to what I say. ²² 'Men of Israel, listen to what I am going to say: Jesus the Nazarene was a man commended to you by God by the miracles and portents and signs that God worked through him when he was among you, as you know. ²³ This man, who was put into your power by the deliberate intention and foreknowledge of God, you took and had crucified and killed by men outside the Law. ²⁴ But <u>God</u> raised him to life, freeing him from the pangs of Hades; for it was impossible for him to be held in its power since, ²⁵ as David says of him: I kept the Lord before my sight always, for with him at my right hand nothing can shake me. ²⁶ So my heart rejoiced my tongue delighted; my body, too, will rest secure, ²⁷ for you will not abandon me to Hades or allow your holy one to see corruption. ²⁸ You have taught me the way of life, you will fill me with joy in your presence. ²⁹ 'Brothers, no one can deny that the patriarch David himself is dead and buried: his tomb is still with us. 30 But since he was a prophet, and knew that God had sworn him an oath to make one of his descendants succeed him on the throne, ³¹ he spoke with foreknowledge about the resurrection of the Christ: he is the one who was not abandoned to Hades, and whose body did not see corruption. ³² God raised this man Jesus to life, and of that we are all witnesses.

Responsorial Psalm, *Psalms 16:1-2, 5, 7-8, 9-10, 11*

- ¹ [In a quiet voice Of David] Protect me, O God, in you is my refuge. ² To <u>Yahweh</u> I say, 'You are my Lord, my <u>happiness</u> is in none
- ⁵ My birthright, my cup is Yahweh; you, you alone, hold my <u>lot</u> secure.
- ⁷ I bless <u>Yahweh</u> who is my counsellor, even at night my heart instructs me. ⁸ I keep <u>Yahweh</u> before me always, for with him at my <u>right</u> hand, nothing can shake me.
- ⁹ So my heart rejoices, my <u>soul</u> delights, my body too <u>will</u> rest secure, ¹⁰ for you <u>will</u> not abandon me to Sheol, you cannot allow your faithful servant to see the abyss.
- ¹¹ You <u>will</u> teach me the path of life, unbounded joy in your presence, at your <u>right</u> hand delight for ever.

Reading 2, Colossians 3:1-4

¹ Since you have been raised up to be with Christ, you must look for the things that are above, where <u>Christ</u> is, sitting at God's <u>right</u> hand. ² Let your thoughts be on things above, not on the things that are on the earth, ³ because you have died, and now the <u>life</u> you have is hidden with <u>Christ</u> in God. ⁴ But when <u>Christ</u> is revealed -- and he is your life-you, too, <u>will</u> be revealed with him in glory.

Gospel, Matthew 28:8-15

⁸ Filled with awe and great joy the women came quickly away from the <u>tomb</u> and ran to tell his disciples. ⁹ And suddenly, coming to meet them, was Jesus. 'Greetings,' he said. And the women came up to him and, clasping his feet, they did him homage. ¹⁰ Then <u>Jesus</u> said to them, 'Do not be afraid; go and tell my brothers that they must leave for Galilee; there they <u>will</u> see me.' ¹¹ Now while they were on their way, some of the guards went off into the city to tell the chief priests all that had happened. ¹² These held a meeting with the elders and, after some discussion, handed a considerable sum of money to the soldiers ¹³ with these instructions, 'This is what you must say, "His disciples came during the night and <u>stole</u> him away while we were asleep." ¹⁴ And should the governor come to hear of this, we undertake

to put things <u>right</u> with him ourselves and to see that you do not get into trouble.' ¹⁵ So they took the money and carried out their instructions, and to this day that is the story among the Jews.
