# Daily Reading for 7th Sunday of Easter - A

### Reading 1, Acts 1:12-14

<sup>12</sup> So from the Mount of Olives, as it is called, they went back to Jerusalem, a short distance away, no more than a <u>Sabbath</u> walk; <sup>13</sup> and when they reached the city they went to the upper room where they were staying; there were Peter and John, <u>James</u> and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, <u>Bartholomew</u> and Matthew, <u>James</u> son of Alphaeus and Simon the Zealot, and <u>Jude</u> son of James. <sup>14</sup> With one heart all these joined constantly in prayer, together with some women, including <u>Mary</u> the mother of Jesus, and with his brothers.

## Responsorial Psalm, Psalms 27:1, 4, 7-8

<sup>1</sup> [Of David] <u>Yahweh</u> is my light and my salvation, whom should I fear? <u>Yahweh</u> is the fortress of my life, whom should I dread?

<sup>4</sup> One thing I ask of Yahweh, one thing I seek: to dwell in Yahweh's house all the days of my life, to enjoy the sweetness of Yahweh, to seek out his temple.

<sup>7</sup> Yahweh, hear my voice as I cry, pity me, answer me! <sup>8</sup> Of you my heart has said, 'Seek his face!' Your face, Yahweh, I seek;

### Reading 2, First Peter 4:13-16

<sup>13</sup> but in so far as you share in the sufferings of Christ, be glad, so that you may enjoy a much greater gladness when his glory is revealed. <sup>14</sup> If you are insulted for bearing Christ's name, blessed are you, for on you rests the <u>Spirit</u> of God, the <u>Spirit</u> of glory. <sup>15</sup> None of you should ever

deserve to suffer for being a murderer, a thief, a criminal or an informer; <sup>16</sup> but if any one of you should suffer for being a Christian, then there must be no shame but thanksgiving to <u>God</u> for bearing this name.

#### Gospel, *John 17:1-11*

<sup>1</sup> After saying this, Jesus raised his eyes to heaven and said: Father, the hour has come: glorify your Son so that your Son may glorify you; <sup>2</sup> so that, just as you have given him power over all humanity, he may give eternal life to all those you have entrusted to him. <sup>3</sup> And eternal <u>life</u> is this: to know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent. 4 I have glorified you on earth by finishing the work that you gave me to do. <sup>5</sup> Now, Father, glorify me with that glory I had with you before ever the world existed. <sup>6</sup> I have revealed your name to those whom you took from the world to give me. They were yours and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. <sup>7</sup> Now at last they have recognised that all you have given me comes from you 8 for I have given them the teaching you gave to me, and they have indeed accepted it and know for certain that I came from you, and have believed that it was you who sent me. 9 It is for them that I pray. I am not praying for the world but for those you have given me, because they belong to you. <sup>10</sup> All I have is yours and all you have is mine, and in them I am glorified. 11 I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, keep those you have given me true to your name, so that they may be one like us.
