Daily Reading for 12th Sunday of Ordinary time - A

Reading 1, Jeremiah 20:10-13

¹⁰ I heard so many disparaging me, 'Terror on every side! Denounce him! Let us denounce him!' All those who were on <u>good</u> terms with me watched for my downfall, 'Perhaps he <u>will</u> be seduced into error. Then we shall get the better of him and take our revenge!' ¹¹ But <u>Yahweh</u> is at my side like a mighty hero; my opponents <u>will</u> stumble, vanquished, confounded by their failure; everlasting, unforgettable disgrace <u>will</u> be theirs. ¹² Yahweh Sabaoth, you who test the upright, observer of motives and thoughts, I shall see your vengeance on them, for I have revealed my <u>cause</u> to you. ¹³ Sing to Yahweh, praise Yahweh, for he has delivered the <u>soul</u> of one in need from the clutches of <u>evil</u> doers.

Responsorial Psalm, Psalms 69:8-10, 14, 17, 33-35

⁸ I am estranged from my brothers, alienated from my own mother's sons; ⁹ for I am eaten up with <u>zeal</u> for your house, and insults directed against you fall on me. ¹⁰ I mortify myself with fasting, and find myself insulted for it,

¹⁴ Rescue me from the mire before I sink in; so I shall be saved from those who hate me, from the watery depths. ¹⁷ do not turn away from your servant, be quick to answer me, for I am in trouble.

³³ For <u>God</u> listens to the poor, he has never scorned his captive people.
³⁴ Let <u>heaven</u> and earth and seas, and all that stirs in them, acclaim him!
³⁵ For <u>God will</u> save Zion, and rebuild the cities of Judah, and people <u>will</u> live there on their own land;

Reading 2, Romans 5:12-15

¹² Well then; it was through one <u>man</u> that <u>sin</u> came into the world, and through <u>sin</u> death, and thus death has spread through the whole human race because everyone has sinned. ¹³ Sin already existed in the world before there was any law, even though <u>sin</u> is not reckoned when there is no law.
¹⁴ Nonetheless death reigned over all from <u>Adam</u> to Moses, even over those whose <u>sin</u> was not the breaking of a commandment, as Adam's was. He prefigured the One who was to come . . . ¹⁵ There is no comparison between the free gift and the offence. If death came to many through the offence of one man, how much greater an effect the <u>grace</u> of <u>God</u> has had, coming to so many and so plentifully as a free gift through the one <u>man Jesus</u> Christ!

Gospel, Matthew 10:26-33

²⁶ 'So do not be afraid of them. Everything now covered up <u>will</u> be uncovered, and everything now hidden <u>will</u> be made clear. ²⁷ What I say to you in the dark, tell in the daylight; what you hear in whispers, proclaim from the housetops.
²⁸ 'Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul; fear him rather who can destroy both body and <u>soul</u> in hell. ²⁹ Can you not buy two sparrows for a penny? And yet not one falls to the ground without your Father knowing. ³⁰ Why, every hair on your head has been counted. ³¹ So there is no need to be afraid; you are worth more than many sparrows. ³² 'So if anyone declares himself for me in the presence of human beings, I <u>will</u> declare myself for him in the presence of my Father in heaven. ³³ But the one who disowns me in the presence of human beings, I <u>will</u> disown in the presence of my Father in heaven.
