Reading for 16th Sunday of ordinary time - A

Reading 1, Wisdom 12:13, 16-19

¹³ For there is no god, other than you, who cares for every one, to whom you have to prove that your sentences have been just. ¹⁶ For your <u>strength</u> is the basis of your saving justice, and your sovereignty over all makes you lenient to all. ¹⁷ You show your <u>strength</u> when people <u>will</u> not believe in your absolute power, and you confound any insolence in those who do know it. ¹⁸ But you, controlling your strength, are mild in judgement, and govern us with great lenience, for you have only to will, and your power is there. ¹⁹ By acting thus, you have taught your people that the upright must be kindly to his fellows, and you have given your <u>children</u> the <u>good hope</u> that after sins you <u>will</u> grant repentance.

Responsorial Psalm, *Psalms 86:5-6, 9-10, 15-16*

⁵ Lord, you are kind and forgiving, rich in faithful love for all who call upon you. ⁶ Yahweh, hear my prayer, listen to the sound of my pleading.

⁹ All nations <u>will</u> come and adore you, Lord, and give <u>glory</u> to your name. ¹⁰ For you are great and do marvellous deeds, you, God, and none other.

¹⁵ But you, Lord, <u>God</u> of tenderness and mercy, slow to anger, rich in faithful love and loyalty, ¹⁶ turn to me and pity me. Give to your servant your strength, to the child of your servant your saving help,

Reading 2, Romans 8:26-27

²⁶ And as well as this, the <u>Spirit</u> too comes to help us in our weakness, for, when we do not know how to pray properly, then the <u>Spirit</u> personally makes our petitions for us in groans that cannot be put into words; ²⁷ and he who can see into all hearts knows what the <u>Spirit</u> means because the <u>prayers</u> that the <u>Spirit</u> makes for God's holy people are always in accordance with the <u>mind</u> of God.

Gospel, Matthew 13:24-43

²⁴ He put another parable before them, 'The kingdom of <u>Heaven</u> may be compared to a <u>man</u> who sowed <u>good</u> seed in his field. ²⁵ While everybody was asleep his enemy came, sowed darnel all among the wheat, and made off. ²⁶ When the new wheat sprouted and ripened, then the darnel appeared as well. ²⁷ The owner's labourers went to him and said, "Sir, was it not <u>good</u> seed that you sowed in your field? If so, where does the darnel come from?" ²⁸ He said to them, "Some enemy has done this." And the labourers said, "Do you

want us to go and weed it out?" ²⁹ But he said, "No, because when you weed out the darnel you might pull up the wheat with it. ³⁰ Let them both grow till the harvest; and at harvest time I shall say to the reapers: First collect the darnel and tie it in bundles to be burnt, then gather the wheat into my barn." ' ³¹ He put another parable before them, 'The kingdom of Heaven is like a mustard seed which a man took and sowed in his field. ³² It is the smallest of all the seeds, but when it has grown it is the biggest of shrubs and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air can come and shelter in its branches.' ³³ He told them another parable, 'The kingdom of Heaven is like the yeast a woman took and mixed in with three measures of flour till it was leavened all through.'

³⁴ In all this <u>Jesus</u> spoke to the crowds in parables; indeed, he would never speak to them except in parables. ³⁵ This was to fulfil what was spoken by the prophet: I <u>will</u> speak to you in parables, unfold what has been hidden since the <u>foundation</u> of the world. ³⁶ Then, leaving the crowds, he went to the house; and his disciples came to him and said, 'Explain to us the parable about the darnel in the field.' ³⁷ He said in reply, 'The sower of the <u>good</u> seed is the Son of man. ³⁸ The field is the world; the <u>good</u> seed is the subjects of the kingdom; the darnel, the subjects of the <u>Evil</u> One; ³⁹ the enemy who sowed it, the devil; the harvest is the end of the world; the reapers are the angels. ⁴⁰ Well then, just as the darnel is gathered up and burnt in the fire, so

it <u>will</u> be at the end of time. ⁴¹ The Son of <u>man will</u> send his <u>angels</u> and they <u>will</u> gather out of his kingdom all causes of falling and all who do evil, ⁴² and throw them into the blazing furnace, where there <u>will</u> be weeping and grinding of teeth. ⁴³ Then the upright <u>will</u> shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Anyone who has ears should listen!
