⁹ Rejoice heart and soul, daughter of Zion! Shout for joy, daughter of Jerusalem! Look, your king is approaching, he is vindicated and victorious, humble and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey.
¹⁰ He <u>will</u> banish chariots from Ephraim and horses from Jerusalem; the bow of <u>war will</u> be banished. He <u>will</u> proclaim peace to the nations, his empire <u>will</u> stretch from sea to sea, from the River to the limits of the earth.

¹ [Hymn of Praise Of David] I shall praise you to the heights, <u>God</u> my King, I shall bless your name for ever and ever. ² Day after day I shall bless you, I shall praise your name for ever and ever.

⁸ Yahweh is tenderness and pity, slow to anger, full of faithful love. ⁹ Yahweh is generous to all, his tenderness embraces all his creatures.

¹⁰ All your creatures shall thank you, Yahweh, and your faithful shall bless you.
 ¹¹ They shall speak of the glory of your kingship and tell of your might,

¹³ Your kingship is a kingship for ever, your reign lasts from age to age. <u>Yahweh</u> is trustworthy in all his words, and upright in all his deeds.
 ¹⁴ Yahweh supports all who stumble, lifts up those who are bowed down.

Reading 2, Romans 8:9, 11-13

⁹ You, however, live not by your natural inclinations, but by the Spirit, since the <u>Spirit</u> of <u>God</u> has made a home in you. Indeed, anyone who does not have the <u>Spirit</u> of <u>Christ</u> does not belong to him. ¹¹ and if the <u>Spirit</u> of him who raised <u>Jesus</u> from the dead has made his home in you, then he who raised <u>Christ Jesus</u> from the dead <u>will</u> give <u>life</u> to your own mortal bodies through his <u>Spirit</u> living in you. ¹² So then, my brothers, we have no <u>obligation</u> to human <u>nature</u> to be dominated by it. ¹³ If you do live in that way, you are doomed to die; but if by the <u>Spirit</u> you put to death the habits originating in the body, you <u>will</u> have life.

Gospel, Matthew 11:25-30

²⁵ At that <u>time Jesus</u> exclaimed, 'I bless you, Father, <u>Lord</u> of <u>heaven</u> and of earth, for hiding these things from the learned and the clever and revealing them to little children. ²⁶ Yes, Father, for that is what it pleased you to do. ²⁷ Everything has been entrusted to me by my Father; and no one knows the Son except the Father, just as no one knows the Father except the Son and those to whom the Son chooses to reveal him. ²⁸ 'Come to me, all you who labour and are overburdened, and I <u>will</u> give you rest. ²⁹ Shoulder my yoke and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you <u>will</u> find rest for your souls. ³⁰ Yes, my yoke is easy and my burden light.'
