Reading 1, *Isaiah 56:1*, 6-7

¹ Thus says Yahweh: Make fair judgement your concern, act with justice, for soon my <u>salvation will</u> come and my saving <u>justice</u> be manifest. ⁶ As for foreigners who adhere to <u>Yahweh</u> to serve him, to love Yahweh's name and become his servants, all who observe the Sabbath, not profaning it, and cling to my covenant: ⁷ these I shall lead to my holy mountain and make them joyful in my house of prayer. Their burnt <u>offerings</u> and sacrifices <u>will</u> be accepted on my altar, for my house <u>will</u> be called a house of <u>prayer</u> for all peoples.

Reading 2, Romans 11:13-15, 29-32

13 Let me say then to you gentiles that, as far as I am an apostle to the gentiles, I take <u>pride</u> in this work of service; ¹⁴ and I want it to be the means of rousing to <u>envy</u> the people who are my own blood-relations and so of saving some of them. ¹⁵ Since their rejection meant the <u>reconciliation</u> of the world, do you know what their re-acceptance <u>will</u> mean? Nothing less than <u>life</u> from the dead! ²⁹ There is no change of <u>mind</u> on God's part about the <u>gifts</u> he has made or of his choice. ³⁰ Just as you were in the past disobedient to <u>God</u> but now you have been shown mercy, through their disobedience; ³¹ so in the same way they are disobedient now, so that through the mercy shown to you they too <u>will</u> receive mercy. ³² God has imprisoned all human beings in their own disobedience only to show mercy to them all.

Gospel, *Matthew 15:21-28*

²¹ Jesus left that place and withdrew to the region of <u>Tyre</u> and Sidon. ²² And suddenly out came a Canaanite <u>woman</u> from that district and started shouting, 'Lord, Son of David, take pity on me. My daughter is tormented by a devil.' ²³ But he said not a word in answer to her. And his disciples went and pleaded with him, saying, 'Give her what she wants, because she keeps shouting after us.' ²⁴ He said in reply, 'I was sent only to the lost sheep of the House of Israel.' ²⁵ But the <u>woman</u> had come up and was bowing low before him. 'Lord,' she said, 'help me.' ²⁶ He replied, 'It is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to little dogs.' ²⁷ She retorted, 'Ah yes, Lord; but even little dogs eat the scraps that fall from their masters' table.' ²⁸ Then <u>Jesus</u> answered her, 'Woman, you have great faith. Let your desire be granted.' And from that moment her daughter was well again.
