Reading for 28th Sunday of Ordinary time - A

Reading 1, Isaiah 25:6-10

⁶ On this mountain, for all peoples, <u>Yahweh Sabaoth</u> is preparing a banquet of rich food, a banquet of fine wines, of succulent food, of well-strained wines. ⁷ On this mountain, he has destroyed the veil which used to veil all peoples, the <u>pall</u> enveloping all nations; ⁸ he has destroyed death for ever. <u>Lord Yahweh</u> has wiped away the tears from every cheek; he has taken his people's shame away everywhere on earth, for <u>Yahweh</u> has spoken. ⁹ And on that day, it <u>will</u> be said, 'Look, this is our God, in him we put our <u>hope</u> that he should save us, this is Yahweh, we put our <u>hope</u> in him. Let us exult and rejoice since he has saved us.' ¹⁰ For Yahweh's hand <u>will</u> rest on this mountain, and Moab <u>will</u> be trodden under his feet as straw is trodden into the dung-heap.

Responsorial Psalm, Psalms 23:1-3, 3-4, 5, 6

¹ [Psalm Of David] <u>Yahweh</u> is my shepherd, I lack nothing. ² In grassy meadows he lets me lie. By tranquil streams he leads me ³ to restore my spirit. He guides me in paths of saving <u>justice</u> as befits his name. ⁴ Even were I to walk in a ravine as dark as death I should fear no danger, for you are at my side. Your staff and your crook are there to soothe me.

⁵ You prepare a table for me under the eyes of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup brims over.

⁶ Kindness and faithful love pursue me every day of my life. I make my home in the house of <u>Yahweh</u> for all <u>time</u> to come.

Reading 2, Philippians 4:12-14, 19-20

¹² I know how to live modestly, and I know how to live luxuriously too: in every way now I have mastered the <u>secret</u> of all conditions: full stomach and empty stomach, plenty and poverty. ¹³ There is nothing I cannot do in the One who strengthens me. ¹⁴ All the same, it was <u>good</u> of you to share with me in my hardships. ¹⁹ And my <u>God will</u> fulfil all your needs out of the riches of his <u>glory</u> in <u>Christ</u> Jesus. ²⁰ And so <u>glory</u> be to <u>God</u> our Father, for ever and ever. Amen.

Gospel, Matthew 22:1-14

¹ Jesus began to speak to them in parables once again, ² 'The kingdom of Heaven may be compared to a king who gave a feast for his son's wedding. ³ He sent his servants to call those who had been invited, but they would not come. ⁴ Next he sent some more servants with the words, "Tell those who have been invited: Look, my banquet is all prepared, my oxen and fattened cattle have been slaughtered, everything is ready. Come to the wedding." ⁵ But they were not interested: one went off to his farm, another to his business, ⁶ and the rest seized his servants, maltreated them and killed them. ⁷ The king was furious. He despatched his troops, destroyed those murderers and burnt their town.⁸ Then he said to his servants, "The wedding is ready; but as those who were invited proved to be unworthy, ⁹ go to the main crossroads and invite everyone you can find to come to the wedding." ¹⁰ So these servants went out onto the roads and collected together everyone they could find, bad and good alike; and the wedding hall was filled with guests. ¹¹ When the king came in to look at the guests he noticed one man who was not wearing a wedding garment, ¹² and said to him, "How did you get in here, my friend, without a wedding garment?" And the man was silent. ¹³ Then the king said to the attendants, "Bind him hand and foot and throw him into the darkness outside, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth." ¹⁴ For many are invited but not all are chosen.'
