Reading for ST. JOHN, APOSTLE & EVANGELIST - 27.12

Reading 1, First John 1:1-4

¹ Something which has existed since the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our own eyes, which we have watched and touched with our own hands, the Word of <u>life</u> -- this is our theme. ² That <u>life</u> was made visible; we saw it and are giving our testimony, declaring to you the eternal life, which was present to the Father and has been revealed to us. ³ We are declaring to you what we have seen and heard, so that you too may share our life. Our <u>life</u> is shared with the Father and with his Son <u>Jesus</u> Christ. ⁴ We are writing this to you so that our joy may be complete.

Gospel, *John 20:2-8*

² and came running to <u>Simon Peter</u> and the other disciple, the one whom <u>Jesus</u> loved. 'They have taken the <u>Lord</u> out of the tomb,' she said, 'and we don't know where they have put him.' ³ So Peter set out with the other <u>disciple</u> to go to the tomb. ⁴ They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the <u>tomb</u> first; ⁵ he bent down and saw the linen cloths <u>lying</u> on the ground, but did not go in. ⁶ Simon Peter, following him, also came up, went into the tomb, saw the linen cloths <u>lying</u> on the ground ⁷ and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. ⁸ Then the other <u>disciple</u> who had reached the <u>tomb</u> first also went in; he saw and he believed.
