# Reading for Second Sunday of ordinary time - B

## Reading 1, First Samuel 3:3-10, 19

- <sup>3</sup> The lamp of <u>God</u> had not yet gone out, and Samuel was <u>lying</u> in Yahweh's sanctuary, where the ark of <u>God</u> was, <sup>4</sup> when <u>Yahweh</u> called, 'Samuel! Samuel!' He answered, 'Here I am,' <sup>5</sup> and, running to Eli, he said, 'Here I am, as you called me.' <u>Eli</u> said, 'I did not call. Go back and lie down.' So he went and lay down. <sup>6</sup> And again <u>Yahweh</u> called, 'Samuel! Samuel!' He got up and went to <u>Eli</u> and said, 'Here I am, as you called me.' He replied, 'I did not call, my son; go back and lie down.'

  <sup>7</sup> As yet, Samuel had no <u>knowledge</u> of <u>Yahweh</u> and the word of <u>Yahweh</u> had not yet been revealed to him.
- <sup>8</sup> Again <u>Yahweh</u> called, the third time. He got up and went to <u>Eli</u> and said, 'Here I am, as you called me.' <u>Eli</u> then understood that <u>Yahweh</u> was calling the child, <sup>9</sup> and he said to Samuel, 'Go and lie down, and if someone calls say, "Speak, Yahweh; for your servant is listening." 'So Samuel went and lay down in his place. <sup>10</sup> Yahweh then came and stood by, calling as he had done before, 'Samuel! Samuel!' Samuel answered, 'Speak, Yahweh; for your servant is listening.' <sup>19</sup> Samuel grew up. <u>Yahweh</u> was with him and did not let a single word fall to the ground of all that he had told him.

#### Responsorial Psalm, *Psalms 40:2, 4, 7-8, 8-9, 10*

- <sup>2</sup> He pulled me up from the seething chasm, from the mud of the mire. He set my feet on rock, and made my footsteps firm.
- <sup>4</sup> How blessed are those who put their trust in Yahweh, who have not sided with rebels and those who have gone astray in falsehood.
- <sup>7</sup> then I said, 'Here I am, I am coming.' In the scroll of the book it is written of me,
- <sup>8</sup> my delight is to do your will; your law, my God, is deep in my heart.
- <sup>9</sup> I proclaimed the saving <u>justice</u> of <u>Yahweh</u> in the great assembly. See, I <u>will</u> not hold my tongue, as you well know.
- <sup>10</sup> I have not kept your saving <u>justice</u> locked in the depths of my heart, but have spoken of your constancy and saving help. I have made no <u>secret</u> of your faithful and steadfast love, in the great assembly.

#### Reading 2, First Corinthians 6:13-15, 17-20

<sup>13</sup> Foods are for the stomach, and the stomach is for foods; and <u>God will</u> destroy them both. But the body is not for sexual immorality; <sup>14</sup> it is for the Lord, and the <u>Lord</u> is for the body. <u>God</u> raised up the <u>Lord</u> and he <u>will</u> raise us up too by his power. <sup>15</sup> Do you not realise that your bodies are members of Christ's body; do you think one can take parts of Christ's body and join them to the body of a prostitute? Out of the question! <sup>17</sup> But anyone who attaches himself to the <u>Lord</u> is one <u>spirit</u> with him. <sup>18</sup> Keep away from sexual immorality. All other sins that people may commit are done outside the body; but the sexually immoral <u>person</u> sins against his own body. <sup>19</sup> Do you not realize that your body is the <u>temple</u> of the Holy Spirit, who is in you and whom you received from God? <sup>20</sup> You are not your own property, then; you have been bought at a price. So use your body for the glory of God.

### Gospel, *John 1:35-42*

<sup>35</sup> The next day as <u>John</u> stood there again with two of his disciples, Jesus went past, <sup>36</sup> and John looked towards him and said, 'Look, there is the lamb of God.' 37 And the two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus. <sup>38</sup> Jesus turned round, saw them following and said, 'What do you want?' They answered, 'Rabbi' -- which means Teacher -- 'where do you live?' 39 He replied, 'Come and see'; so they went and saw where he lived, and stayed with him that day. It was about the tenth hour. 40 One of these two who became followers of <u>Jesus</u> after hearing what <u>John</u> had said was Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter. 41 The first thing Andrew did was to find his brother and say to him, 'We have found the Messiah' -- which means the Christ- 42 and he took Simon to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said, 'You are Simon son of John; you are to be called Cephas' -which means Rock.
